Woodfords' Early Childhood Services Program offers special purpose preschool programming to young students ages 3-5 with autism and related disabilities. The program utilizes the evidence based principles and practices of Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) to help students make and sustain gains in key areas of development that help them function more successfully in home, community, and school-based settings.

Intensive instruction is most often provided to students in 1:1 teacher to student ratios and aims to address key functional areas including communication, cognition, daily living skills, socialization skills, motor functioning, behavior and more.

Enrolled students are most often referred through Child Development Services (CDS), their pediatrician, or other provider. Depending on each student's level of need and individualized goal areas, children attend preschool five days a week for either half or full days. Preschool programming is provided year-round.
