



Adult Case Management

Woodfords' Adult Case Management Program provides on-going resource connection and support to help adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families lead meaningful lives and reach their goals.

Woodfords' Adult Case Management Program is designed to provide a wide variety of supports to adults with disabilities and their families. Case managers link individuals and their families to resources and services in their own communities. Case managers work with adult consumers to identify their interests, strengths and vision for their desired lives, and to develop a plan to help them achieve their goals.

Services can range from informational to intensive, defined by the amount of support and intervention an adult and their family requests.

Woodfords Adult Case Management Program provides services to adults in York and Cumberland counties. To be eligible for adult case management services an individual must be 18 years or older, have a diagnosis of an intellectual or developmental disability, and qualify for MaineCare coverage. The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Office of Aging and Disability Services determines eligibility and provides referrals to case management agencies.

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
